2026 Team Green Rules Summary

The following rules apply to riders who wish to compete for the 2026 Kawasaki Team Green Grand Prize:

- Riders must be registered on the Team Green Website by June 1, 2026 (previous year entrants will be asked to reconfirm their registration) to compete for the Grand Prize
- **NEW:** Up to **20** results earn points
- **NEW:** Open to all amateur and pro riders
- **NEW:** Open to riders in any class in all Eligible Series (including classes not eligible for championship contingency prizes)
- **NEW:** Points can be earned in any series, in any state including motocross, off-road, enduro, flat track, and supermoto
- Points are earned for finishing positions
- There must be a total of five or more riders in a race to earn points
- Open to 2022 and newer models only
- Bikes must be registered to rider or a family member
- Riders may only earn points in 1 class for one registered VIN number
- Riders with 2 or more Kawasaki Motorcycles registered can earn points in up to 3 classes
- Previous year winners are ineligible for the Grand Prize

Contingency Prizes Summary

Contingency prizes can be claimed by riders anytime before November 30, 2026. Riders do not have to register before this time to claim contingency. Contingency prize is available to any model year of Kawasaki.

Contingency prizes for WCAN, ECAN, TransCan, Corduroy Enduro, and Triple Crown are awarded in cash.

All other contingency prizes are awarded in the form of contingency credits to be used on Kawasaki product at participating Kawasaki dealerships.

Important note: Riders, teams, and championship organizations have until April 30, 2026 to request a name change for their series or one of the classes. No additional classes will be created.

Riders must claim their prize on the TeamGreenCanada website by November 30, 2026.

This year's program runs from **March 1st, 2026 to November 31st, 2026** inclusively and riders have until **June 30, 2026** to register. New or used 2022 or newer Canadian model KX and KLX are eligible to compete for Team Green Contingency Credits and the Team Green Grand Prize.
